## Speaker: Rea Callander of the Nevada County Fair

Country Christmas Fair is the next event at the fairgrounds and Rea brought free tickets for everyone.

Rea was raised in Hawaii till he was 12. His parents came from ranching families in Hawaii. The family found a 2000 acre ranch in south county and has a history with livestock at the Nevada County Fair. After attending college in Silicon Valley, Rea started a website agency. He sold that

then started a fundraising website called School Pop. The site helped raise \$250million for schools. Rea moved backed to the area for the CEO job at the Fairgrounds and he is honored to be the CEO and loves to help the community.

There are 76 fairs in California that provide \$3.9 billion in jobs in the state. The livestock alone provides \$10million in revenue. Nevada County Fair



generates \$28million in spending and attracts 270,000 people. Treat Street topped \$1,000,000 in sales this year. The Nevada County Fair started in 1947. Rea's favorite day is Community Involvement Day, the Monday before the fair begins, where there were 107 blood donors, 800 books donated, 1800 pounds of food donated, 200+ eye glasses, and over 100 dresses to the Cinderella project. Treat Street is dedicated to nonprofits and the fair puts money back into Treat Street to help increase those dollars such as the shade structures that were recently put in. In 2017 there were over 7000 exhibits with 3200 of them from youth. One person had 122 entries. Junior livestock auction is a focus of growth. This auction generated \$492k in 2016, and \$541K in 2017. This last year there were over \$60k in bumps which are donations made straight to the youth. The Nevada County Fairgrounds has \$2.4 million in gross revenue and a net income of one and a half or two percent. The state gives \$35k from the general fund. Parking revenue stays at the Fairgrounds. The Fairgrounds is a great resource to the community as we saw with the fires and recent evacuation needs. The Fairgrounds is compensated by Cal Fire and OES for use of the fairgrounds when an evacuation center. When the Oroville Dam incident happened there were over a 1000 evacuees and 100 animals staying for seven days. The fire camp hosted 1600 fireman. During the recent fire storms in California 17 fairs were operation centers. The fair is 55% of the Fairgrounds overall revenue. Draft Horse Classic is the largest draft horse show in the west. The Fairgounds also hosts five music festivals, car shows, craft fairs, Brewfest, weddings, quilt shows, and community meetings and events. The Fairgrounds has Tall Pines preschools and a RV Park.
