4 Star Rating for the Rotary Foundation

The Rotary Foundation earned a 4-star rating from Charity Navigator, the largest and most prestigious independent evaluator of nonprofits in the United States.

The 4-star rating, the highest that Charity Navigator awards, recognizes sound fiscal management and commitment to accountability and transparency. Charity Navigator evaluates thousands of nonprofits each year, and only one of four earns 4 stars.

This year's top distinction marks the Foundation's sixth straight, placing it in the top 3 percent of U.S.-based charities. In a letter to the Foundation, Ken Berger, the president of Charity Navigator, wrote, "This 'exceptional' designation differentiates The Rotary Foundation from its peers and demonstrates to the public it is worthy of their trust."

Program: Pat Ward and **Dick Panzica** talked about the Homecoming for the Vietnam War POWs in 1973

October 28, 2013

Pat introduced the guest speaker Rotarian Dick Panzica who was personally involved in the reception of American POW's repatriated from North Vietnam in 1973. Dick showed a touching video about the event. Pat and Dick then talked about the homecoming event. There were 591 POWs



released from North Vietnam, and a total of 660 prisoners including those that were held in South Vietnam. Dick and Pat were in the Air Force stationed in Okinawa at the time and Dick was selected out of his unit to greet and escort a POW home, along with some 107 other escorts.

Dick met his POW, "Jerry" when he arrived at Clark AFB and Jerry talked all night about his time in the "Hanoi Hilton" in North Vietnam. He told Dick that POW's were tortured regularly as part of the North Vietnamese efforts to break them down. Jerry was also kept in solitary confinement for 2 years. The prisoners would communicate between their cells by tapping out messages using a simple code.

Dick spent time with Jerry in Okinawa and then rode back with him to New Jersey and spent a week with him, while Jerry re-acclimated. It wasn't easy and Dick was glad he was there to help Jerry out during this difficult transition.

Dick never spoke to Jerry after that. It was not a part of the program and most POW's just wanted to forget everything associated with their experience.

Pat and Dick then showed a video from the Nixon Presidential Library about a huge party President Nixon threw for the POWs in 1973 on the White House lawn and a 40 year commemoration of that event held at the Nixon Presidential Library.

It was a remarkable tale of courage and patriotism, that with 40 years of hindsight we can see was not properly appreciated by the American public at the time.
