MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Rotary Club of Grass Valley met up at our weekly meeting location, the Wild Eye Pub. The meeting was called to order and presided over by our Vice President, Mr. Ed Pinto. We did have one guest at today's meeting, David Zucca of Nevada City. Welcome! We hope to see you again at our next meeting in November!

We received an update from representatives of the Grass Valley Police Dept. Pink Patch Project. Throughout the month of October, law enforcement departments across the county are raising funds in support of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. All proceeds will benefit the Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital Foundation to support breast cancer imaging services.



Today's speakers were Jamie Hanf and Shannon Glaz from the Nevada County Public Health Department, representing the Clear the Air Nevada County Coalition.

They shared information on the importance of smoke-free housing and the health risks associated with both Second-Hand Smoke (SHS) and Third-Hand Smoke (THS).



They highlighted that chemical residue from tobacco smoke can remain on clothing, skin, furniture, walls, and other surfaces long after smoking has occurred, increasing the risk of cancer and other serious health conditions. The coalition recommends the adoption of smoke-free policies for all multi-unit housing, including balconies, patios, and shared common areas, as the most effective way to reduce SHS and THS exposure.

We have collected 3,000 lbs of plastic so far this year!


