collect water each day. Education, sanitation and hygiene are high on list of projects to incorporate into the Sustainable Cambodia programs. Empowerment is based on 5 – 7 family self-help groups and a Community Development Group with 1 per village. All work is done 100% volunteer. Latrines are being built and ponds for water storage are dug. Below ground work is done by Rotarians and recently a back hoe has been provided for this work. Above ground work is done by the families. Ponds serve 20-40 families. Ag Training; sewing programs; meal supplements being provided in schools are just a few of the projects being provided by Sustainable Cambodia in Siem Reip. Schools are now offered from preschool through grades 1-12. Over 300 young adults have graduated from the University Program. Sustainable Cambodia has an annual budget of \$450K - \$500K. Many global Rotary Clubs participate in addition to nationwide clubs to support this effort. Level of offering is broad, \$250.00 per year and up to many thousands. Susan presented our club a laptop cover as a gift and an invitation to participate in the program was encouraged.
