The most significant changes come in the Dues and Meals side. Dues will be \$30 per member per month. This eliminates some of the larger charges some months when Rotary International Dues are due. The cost of meals will remain at \$15 for all events unless announced in advance by the President. There are no missed meetings or make-up charges. The expectation on meals is to pay at the door, or pay in advance, not in arrears as currently practiced. There will be a total of 33 meetings a year at Wild Eye Pub, about 3 times a month, with other meetings and events scheduled and members notified in advance. Fines will continue as has been done all along. The member sets the fine level. We will continue to find ways to support Polio Plus and the Foundation through donations and community events. There will be some member expectations related to Casino Night tickets and auction items. Further information will be coming, but in no event will the total amount be higher than previously required.

Bob estimates that the change in the dues structure will average out at about \$1.34 per month and provides greater flexibility related to meals and attendance. The Admin side budget for Club Expenses, excluding RI dues and meal/meeting related costs, is about \$12,900.

The Club will continue to use the income from Casino Night and the Bike

Challenge to support Community Service Donations and Projects, somewhere around \$23,500.

The motion to accept was passed overwhelmingly in a hand vote.

Don Daniels pulled the lucky black marble and the meeting closed with the 4 Way Test
