ending in June 2015. He is a multi-Paul Harris Fellow, a Charter Member of District 5190's Paul Harris Society, a member of the Foundation's Bequest Society and a Major Donor to the Rotary Foundation.

Steve provided a PowerPoint presentation on the Rotary Foundation. He said the Foundation is all about "Hands touching Hearts around the world".

He shared a video titled the "Why Story" about a little girl from Brazil who had a deformity to her upper lip and she would cover her face with a doll so that others would not see her lip. With the funds generated through the Rotary Foundation she was provided surgery that corrected this deformity. Her smile was precious. You could see in her eyes the joy that this change made in her life. This video reinforced the reason that we promote the Foundation.

Thanks to the dedicated Rotarians around the world, the Foundation giving steadily increased even during the economic downturn these last four years. During 2013 \$115.7 Million was donated.

Polio Plus: The Foundation has had a significant impact on Rotary's efforts to eradicate polio around the world. In1988 there were 350,000 new polio cases each year. Rotary has achieved amazing results over the last 25 years, although this year there has been

a major out break in the Horn of Africa: Somalia and Kenya.

There are two primary Foundation funds:

1. Annual Programs Fund: These are the funds contributed by the membership. The funds generated by this method are placed in a 3-Year Rest Cycle that is used to generate interest income.

2. Permanent Fund: This is the Foundation's Endowment Fund and our Legacy of Hope. The Goal is to have 1 Billion Dollars in this account by 2025.

There are three types of Donors to this fund:

- Bequest Donors
- Major Donors
- Arch Klumph Hall of Honor

The Tubs and Tubes flow chart presents a great illustration of how the Foundation funds flow.

Steve provided a little history on the Paul Harris Fellow Award. In 1947 Paul Harris died. In 1957 the Paul Harris Fellow was created. Even back then \$1,000 donation was required to be recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow. To put that amount in today's dollars, it would require over an \$8,000 donation to equate to a \$1,000 donation in 1957.

Steve also shared about the New Grant Model and the Foundations six areas of focus. He closed his presentation with a song from Lacy J Dalton, which was written specifically for the Foundation.

Thanks to Steve Lewis for providing such an interesting presentation.

Following the presentation, President Steve conducted the Raffle. Steve Sauer's ticket was drawn, but unfortunately he drew the white marble. After the club members recited the Four-Way Test, President Steve adjourned the meeting. *Respectfully submitted by Eric Fredrickson*
