# **ACTIVITIES throughout 2023-24**

## MUNA, 11-13 August 2023

Professor Dr Garth Britton PHF was Keynote Speaker at the MUNA Opening, and Ms Lorraine Finlay PHF, the Human Rights Commissioner at the AHRC, was the Keynote Speaker at the Official Dinner and Closing Ceremony. Participants: 48 students in 17 teams attended the successful event. Feedback continues to be outstanding for this flagship event. Core working group included: Garth, Margaret, Helen, David, Greg, Peter and Gabrielle with many other volunteers working over the weekend.

#### International Peace Scholars, 9-12 September 2023 & June 2024

2023 visit had a small cohort of amazing scholars. Program coordination was undertaken by Bruce Osborn with several Sunrisers acting as Hosts and drivers to meetings. The dinner presentations illustrate why Rotarians get so involved. Stories shared were extraordinary. In 2024 Canberra Sunrise took the primary Club role, with stalwarts Garth Britton and Bruce mentoring the new coordinators from RC of Bungendore. Sunrisers contributed to the hosting again and we expect that to continue.

## **BBQs**

These fundraising events have been the main source of funds. Ray Livingstone was the motivator behind BBQ support across various Canberra venues, including Bunnings at Tuggeranong and Gungahlin.

#### Fees

Club fees have risen quickly – from \$185 (2021) to \$234 (June 2024) for a 6-month period. Lunch costs at the Commonwealth Club had increased (\$38 from Jan 2024; \$65+ from July 2024). New venue is less cost. To retain members in 2025, acceptable fees are crucial.

NB: Fees collected are not available for community disbursements – only for administration.

## **SIEC** graduations at Dickson College

President or Past Presidents officiate at the presentation of the Sunrise Rotary Award. Graduation ceremonies are held 3-4 times a year. Sunrise Awards are \$750-1000pa. Sunrise is proud of this continuing Awards opportunity, and relationship with the College.

#### YEP student

Sunrise shared Jonas Stein (Germany), with RC of Canberra. Rebecca McNeill hosted from 14 January for 4 weeks, and also hosted Peace Scholar Yessica. Sunrise is appreciative.

## End Polio Appeal, 28 October 2023

Kim and Shirley hosted a fundraising afternoon tea to raise funds for "End Polio" and cut a special cake to celebrate the 30<sup>th</sup> birthday of Canberra Sunrise.

## DreamCricket, 17 November 2023

Canberra Sunrise and DreamCricket Gala Days date back to our former club member Jonathan Lyall, who built up collaboration with George Huitker, a teacher at Radford College, over a 10+ year period. George was inducted into Canberra Sunrise on 16 July 2023, via sponsorship from DreamCricket Australia, to be able to facilitate DreamCricket clinics in schools across the country, and our Gala Day, with cover through our Rotary Insurance.

The 2023 Gala Day was very successful, with 60 students from 6 local primary schools involved, and the then Governor-General attended to open the occasion. Some 40 student mentors from Grammar assisted. Organisation was undertaken by a small efficient team of Rotarians who deserve congratulations for the highly effective event. Team included: George, Bruce, Ray, Kim, Margaret and Yohan. Help on the day also from Peter, Anna, Neil and Roger. Our club received support from the Canberra Grammar School, DreamCricket Australia, The Lord's Taverners ACT, the Belconnen Rotary Club and Cricket ACT.

The Board agreed on 21 May 2024, to provide cricket sets to Amaroo, Nepal (via Mary Brell, DreamCricket Australia) and Sunshine Coast. A fourth set to be donated to a school in the Canberra region. The Lord's Taverners has donated \$2,000 towards DreamCricket by way of sponsorship for the next Gala Day.

## **Club Strategic Planning & Future Direction**

This has been the club's biggest commitment. Strategists led members to 4 strategic priority teams – Membership, Community, Public Image and Club Service – to develop priorities and Action Plans to achieve the agreed goals.

Board adopted 'Membership development' paper prepared by David Elder. Three options:

- a. Continue as we have and face an inevitable process of decline (current situation);
- b. Reinvent the Club to align with a more viable approach to the future and where we could start to attract new members;
- c. Consider amalgamating with another Club

Club Planning Day on 16 March 2024 produced agreement to progress options to merge with another club or clubs. Progress has been slow. Members to receive timely updates.
