## OUR RESPONSE TO CYCLONE WINSTON IN FIJI

Cyclone Winston in Fiji was "off the scale" as we all know. After an assessment, we soon had volunteer DARTs deployed in the affected areas: Peter Hazel (UK and Team Leader), Wayne Beaumier (USA), Howard Bradfield (Australia), Steve Lister and Craig Roberts (UK). They worked closely with local Rotarians and villagers; a vital aspect of our work.

Our response to the horrific event included provision of Home Repair Kits to nine villages. All materials were purchased locally, with Fijian Rotarians negotiating excellent prices for timber, galvanized iron and tools.

DART Peter Hazel, in his report from Fiji, says it all: "without wishing to blow our own trumpet, we are the go-to NGO for government officials; we are the only NGO stating its clear intentions, our area of operation and skill sets and providing exactly what is being requested by those in need.
"And, working with Rotarians has made all the difference."


Disaster Aid International was one of the first NGOs to become a member of Shelter Cluster Fiji, the Coordinator of Humanitarian Shelter following Cyclone Winston. It is part of the Fiji Ministry of Local Government, Housing \& Environment and is under the auspices of the United Nations.


Thanks for supporting our appeal to assist us in Fiji: as always, we are there for 'the long haul'.

## OUR WORK GOES ON IN THE PHILIPPINES

In the Philippines, we continue to deliver aid, primarily life-saving Australian designed and made $\boldsymbol{S k y H y d r a n t} \boldsymbol{t}^{T M}$ water filtration systems. We have worked with our in-country partner and NGO, The Balay Mindanaw Foundation since 2010, and the provision of clean, safe drinking water remains an imperative for both our organisations.

And in Manila, Rhett Butler AM, the Chairman of the Australian SkyJuice Foundation ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ and David Langworthy, Chairman of Disaster Aid International attended the Rotary Presidential WASH (Water Sanitation + Hygiene) Conference with some 800 Filipino Rotarians.


Disaster Aid Taiwan is in the formative stages following a visit to our booth at the RI Convention in São Paulo last year. Informal meetings in Brisbane led to DAI Board member Helene Bo Morse attending the D3460 PETS in Taichung, Taiwan (107 clubs). District Rotary leaders recognise the opportunity of building this global project, especially the water projects. In July 2017, D3460 will become D3461 and D3462. Two clubs from each are accepting responsibility of building this project in Taiwan.

## DAI IN CARTAGENA, COLOMBIA, SOUTH AMERICA



An invitation to attend this Rotary Projects Fair (D4271 and D4281) in Cartagena, the port city on Colombia's Caribbean coast, was extended by senior Colombian Rotarians who visited the Disaster Aid International booth at the RI Convention in São Paulo last year.

David Langworthy (DAI Chairman, Aust.) and William Sommerville (DANZ Director, Wellington, NZ) attended.

From the strong interest shown in what DAI is doing, firstly in São Paulo and then at the Rotary Projects Fair in Cartagena, the Rotarians in Colombia are working to obtain a Foundation Grant to install Australian SkyHydrant ${ }^{\text {M }}$ water filtration systems in 79 rural schools. The RC Bogotá Teusaquillo has been asked to manage this project which has an initial value of US\$170,000.

The Rotary Projects Fair, a uniquely Central American annual event, was a first for Colombia. Rotary Clubs are invited to showcase their projects to other Rotary Clubs, with Rotarians from other countries, particularly the USA invited to attend. At this one, there were 60 Rotary Clubs attending, with international visitors from the USA, Spain and of course Australia and New Zealand. And the number of projects? ... 187! Well done David and William - Ed.

## OTHER NEWS SNIPPETS

- Firstly, some Board changes at Disaster Aid Australia (DAA). Long-serving Board members, Geoff Brown and Brian Crews (both members of RC Endeavour Hills) have stepped down, with DAA Chairman Bob Powell paying tribute to their highly valued and active commitment over many years. DARTs Dave Tuzewski (SA) and Helene Bo Morse (Qld) have recently been appointed and welcomed to the Board of DAA.
- In January a busy group of twelve people (mostly from RC Endeavour Hills) packed a 40 ft container with a collection of goods kindly offered to us by Rotary's Donations-in-Kind for our use internationally. The goods have been gratefully received by The Balay Mindanaw Foundation, an NGO in the Philippines who partners with DAI in that country.
- DAA has been represented at District Conferences. D9820 in Wangaratta and D9790 in Bendigo on 27-28 February; D9685 in Canberra on 11-12 March; D9500 in Barossa, SA and D9465 in Bunbury, WA on 17-20 March, and, coming up, D9520 in Renmark on 28 April-1 May. And DAA was represented at the RC Chadstone/East Malvern Fun Day (by Office Manager Jan Burney) at Central Park, Malvern East on 20 March.
- Finally, DAI is pleased to report that Creative Cooperative Banepa in Nepal has been providing blankets to needy persons, a project sponsored by DAI earlier this year. Our commitment to help in Nepal is ongoing, and more details will be in a future News Update.
