## **News from Youth Exchange Program**

#### A new beginning......

The weekend of 23rd – 24th November saw the completion of training for the new cohort of Australian students that will head out in January for their year abroad living their lives as a Rotary Exchange student. This will be the first time that the Outbounds go out under the new District 9705.

We have twelve amazing young people who have taken up this challenge and on Sunday received both their Certificate on the completion of their training and their blazer.



They now realize what the weight of a Rotary Blazer really means! It is not all the metal pins that they will add to it during their year....although yes, these are important too as each one will represent a memory of a person, and event or occasion... The real weight of their Rotary Blazer is the weight of the responsibility that they have agreed to take on. The responsibility of representing their family, their Rotary Club, their school, their state and their country. They have accepted this responsibility knowing that even they not wear their blazer 24/7, it will sit on their shoulders for the length of their exchange.

The District Youth Exchange Committee feels that this cohort of amazing young people have been well prepared to accept this task. They will leave Australia in January 2020.

#### **TUMUT WEEKEND**

Rotary Youth Exchange students from D9700 and D9710 joined together to experience the wonderful hospitality of the members of the Rotary Club of Tumut. Most were home hosted with the remainder having accommodation in the Riverglades Caravan Park cabins (with chaperones).

Tumut each year, extends this hospitality to the Inbound students, providing them with a wonderful program for the weekend.

First off, was an Aboriginal Cultural experience run by two Aboriginal National Park Rangers. They are exposed to some aboriginal history, what we know as the Digeridoo (not its right name under their mob), girls learning to play the clap sticks and putting a musical item together using these instruments. Then they are taught to weave the reeds into string, then to make a small basket. Then much hilarity as they attempted to throw their boomerangs and get them to return.

The Friday evening is held in the camp kitchen at the Caravan Park where they all get to meet the Tumut members and their partners as they feasted on Pizza!

Next morning, all met up and again jumped on the bus for the hour and half trip to Yarrangobilly Caves. Here they

went on a tour of the Jersey Cave with a National Park guide before having lunch in the grounds. Lunch was prepared by the Tumut Rotarians for all. Then we walked lunch off by walking down the mountain (about  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  kms) to the Artesian Pool. Following their swim then the guide took us along the river and then up the mountain to rejoin the bus for the trip bac k to Tumut.



After a quick clean up we all headed to Brungil Hall where the Tumut Rotarians and partners put on an amazing feast before everyone was encouraged to get up and learn Australian bush dances!

Sunday again saw the Rotarians preparing a barbeque breakfast for everyone before taken to the Labyrinth in the park. This is a



lovely area designed for rest and reflection. The Tumut Labyrinth is in the shape of an Octagon with seven layers of path folded back and forth between the outer edge and the centre. A labyrinth aims for tranquility.

Then all had to say their goodbyes and head back to their homes scattered throughout the two Districts.

Plus will be welcomed to a Civic Reception at Geelong City Hall


