#### **Requirements**

- Rotary may guide an activity at the venue, However, total supervision remains the sole responsibility of the participating school's staff.
- It is also the responsibility of the participating school/organisation to ensure that the visit is endorsed and covered by the school's insurance and policies.
- It is the school's responsibility to ensure parental consent and other relevant insurance has been arranged.

#### **Pre-Visit**

- Teachers must review the "Venue and Safety Information" form and the "WHS Risk Assessment & Control Plan".
- All participants should be informed of relevant control measures and behavioural requirements.

#### **Upon Arrival**

- Teachers will be met on arrival at the debussing point and escorted to the Registration Desk where they will be
  required to register their team and advise numbers while their students and carers will be escorted to their team
  marquee.
- Further instructions will be advised once all the teams have assembled in relation to the opening ceremony, safety requirements and the conduct of the activities. Prior to each activity, the student mentors/volunteers will also provide brief safety suggestions for the well-being of all participants.
