Jun Yang, Executive Director of the City and County of Honolulu Mayor's Office of Housing, began his presentation to our Rotary Club with the question, "Whose responsibility is homelessness?"

There are currently 4,700 homeless people on Oahu. Of that number, 1,600 are unsheltered and 560 are chronically homeless. The mayor's \$3 million initiative, "Housing First," seeks to address this last group, those who have some sort of disability and have been on the street for more than a year. On Oahu, the chronically homeless have been on the street for an average of eight years. Their average age is 62. "Housing First" will provide accommodation in studio apartment-type rentals, and each formerly homeless resident will have an assigned case manager.

The city and county government cannot do this alone. Yang asked RCEH to locate one or two units in the Kapahulu, Kaimuki areas that can be used in the program and assured prospective property managers that case managers will work closely with them to make certain that the rent is paid on time and that the residents are good neighbors.

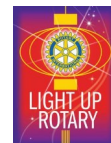
