What's with unmanned systems and what role will they play in our future? Last Monday, Larry Osborn, of Dream Hammer, gave us the answer to those questions.

The commercial applications for unmanned systems are limited only to our imagination.

Already drones are at use in agriculture, mining, film making, underwater exploration, and in space. By the year 2025, the industry will be worth \$82b. Why is that the case? Unmanned systems, says Osborn, are autonomous and efficient. And because they can be miniaturized, they will proliferate. Are there issues surrounding privacy and safety? Yes, confirms Osborn. Before any surveillance can be done, however, warrants are required and existing privacy laws should be enforced. The FAA has established six test sites in the U.S. Hawaii is one of those sites.



Despite resistance in some quarters, and bureaucracy, unmanned systems such as robots and drones will proliferate in the future, and money will be saved.

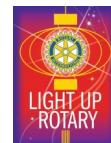

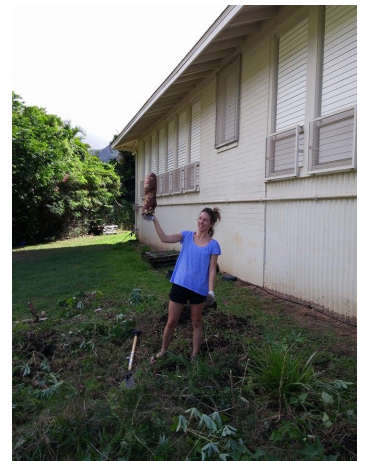
