On September 15, the guest speaker at our Rotary Club of East Honolulu meeting was Travis Councell of the

Hawaii Bicycle League. Focusing primarily on the question of safety, Councell began with a short video. He told club mem-

bers to count the number of times a basketball had been passed. When the video had finished and Rotarians began the number of passes, Councell replayed the video and pointed out a "moon walking bear" that had crossed the screen, a bear that no one had noticed. His point for drivers and cyclists: When you're concentrating on one thing, i.e., number of passes, you often miss something that is right in front of you, i.e., a bear. When you are just looking for other drivers, you might miss the cyclist.

Councell stated that the law calls for more severe penalties for drivers who strike a "vulnerable user," a construction worker in the road, a police officer or fireman at the scene. He also cautioned that, according to the law, cyclists have the right to use a full lane if the road is too narrow for a car to pass a bicycle staying to the right, if the cyclist is avoiding hazards such as pot holes, or if the cyclist is making a left turn.

A call for greater awareness and courtesy from all who share our roads.
