Most recently, Ohana Arts took the tale of Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes and turned it into a musical. The true story of a girl who was two when the atomic bomb struck her home town of Hiroshima and died several years later from the effects of leukemia has provided Rubin and her collaborators with an opportunity to engage 38 students from 15 schools around the island in this new production performed at LCC.

Plans are to perform again in 2015 at venues such as the Neil Blaisdell Center. For the moment, Ohana Arts is focusing on a cast recording of the show.

Rubin asked Rotarians for support in the form of advice, in-kind donations, and monetary donations.

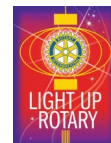
