Put away some of those notions you might have had about providing funds for your children or grandchildren to go to college. Harold Green of HG Capital Advisors, spoke to the Rotary Club of East Honolulu on Monday, February 9, and encouraged us all to take another

look at how best to finance higher education.

The federal government, says Green, has reduced the annual amount of per person financial aid for students from \$8,000 to \$5,000. High school students today are concerned about where to go to college, then about being accepted to that college, and most importantly, they are worried that they will have to sacrifice the choice they have made because their parents will be unable to afford it.

Families tend to have resources on hand for the first year of college, and organizations such as Rotary offer scholarships to high school seniors when they graduate. A student's first year financial aid package is based on expected family income (including scholarships), and succeeding years' aid is based on the first year amount. Green suggests: deferring payout from college funds and scholarships; borrowing a higher amount in the first years; using the money in college savings funds and the awarding of scholarships until later in the students' educational career.
