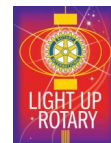

Kelly McCanlies, Director of Privacy Programs for Hawaiian Electric, sleeps well most nights. The types of privacy concerns many of us have do not bother her. She is not concerned about the NSA. There is so much awareness of their activity now, she says, it is not a problem. Identity theft? When it comes to credit cards, consumer liability is minimal. Credit card companies are constantly monitoring usage.

So what does keep McCanlies awake? Medical identity theft is on the rise, and there has not been the same attention paid to this as to the credit card issue. Medical records are not centralized; there is no standardized process for reporting medical insurance information theft. Today, on the street, there is a higher value placed on stolen medical insurance information than on stolen credit information.

McCanlies also worries about 'big data' and big data brokers who are unregulated. Brokers amass information for everything from political campaigns to determining from teenagers' contacts and topics of conversation on social media their likelihood of succeeding in college. 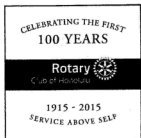
