#### **CLEARING THE PATH FOR CLEAN ENERGY**



Our guest last week was Jeff Mikulina, CEO of the Blue Planet Foundation, which was established for the purpose of clearing the path for clean energy in Hawaii. The goal of BPF is to eliminate the use of fossil fuels, starting in Hawaii. Blue Planet's work seeks

to inspire change in three ways: ADVOCACY - BPF is working to inspire Legislators and PUC's into passing Bill which will enable financing for solar efficiency installations for those who cannot afford the costs up front.

ACTION – Focusing on energy efficiency and grid modernization, smart meters and upgraded appliances which now consume less energy. This alone can save residents over \$1 million over the next 10 years.

AWARENESS – More than 90% of the energy Hawaii consumes for electricity and transportation comes from imported fossil fuel oil. Hawaii currently consumes over 69,000 barrels a day costing us over \$5 billion a year (more than twice as much as we spend on education). In turn, we are tapping into only 18% of the states capacity for renewable energy for electricity. This in a State which has the highest electric rates in the country – three times the national average! We have the power to change (pun intended). Hawaii's unlimited sources puts us in a unique position with the capability to be a world leader in renewable energies. We can lead the world by tapping into unlimited renewable energy sources available to us; sources such as wind, solar, geothermal and waves.

#### Aloha, Wonderful Oahu Rotarians!

The International Jazz 'n' Youth Exchange, in conjunction with Rotary International, will

be coming to Honolulu, Hawaii on June 14th. Students from Germany, Texas, and

Hawaii will take part in a two-week event that will include jazz workshops and clinics, rehearsals, and concert performances. Jazz 'n' Youth exchanges promote cultural sharing, foster international friendships, and provide learning and performing opportunities through jazz music.

The students, ages 14 - 21, will be under the direction of prominent jazz musicians and educators from the US Mainland. Iolani School will host several rehearsals and workshops, and a culminating concert at Seto Hall on Saturday, June 27th.

We are looking for home-stay volunteers to house the visiting students and staff during the second week of the exchange from June 20th through June 27th (8 nights). The

Germans are able to communicate and converse in English. In addition to nightly bedding, we are asking that every home-stay volunteer provide a daily basic breakfast and morning drop-off / late afternoon pick-up at 'Iolani School.

All students will be responsible for purchasing lunch and dinner during home stay, which we will provide time for them to do daily. The one exception will be on the free day (Sun 6/21) Hosts have the option of providing meals for that day, but the students will be told beforehand that they should be responsible to pay for their meals if they need to.

Please contact me if you are willing and interested to volunteer as a home-stay host, and if you would like to find out more about this special project. Your participation will be greatly appreciated! This is a program sponsored by the Rotary Club of Honolulu but you may
