Frazer McGilvray, executive director of Mālama Maunaloa, is an internationally renowned marine natural resource management professional with more than 25 years of experience. Having worked throughout East Asia and the Indo-Pacific, he has

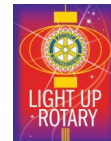
extensive knowledge on marine resource management across several continents. He has worked both on local projects and those that span multiple countries. McGilvray has advised and helped shape government policy in many countries to improve fisheries management, coral reef resilience, food security and economic benefits. His focus is to improve and protect the Maunaloa Bay. There are less fish in the Bay than ever before due to pollution and algae growth. To date they have removed over 1600 tons of algae and composted it for the local farms. That makes up a 1/2 mile of dump trucks full of algae. They have also removed 1500 tons of sediment from the upper streams and drains feeding the bay. They have set up a Huli Program to help remove the algae with the help of the community and anyone who wishes to participate. Frazer touched on the sign wavers and protesters in East Honolulu, protesting the NOAA suggestion of creating a fish sanctuary for the Humpback Wales which he says stems from a complete misinformation of what the sanctuary will entail. It will be to protect the fish in the area and help to increase the fish population. It will also eliminate over fishing in the area which is going on now, It does not mean you will not be able to fish or run you Ski Dues. The organization is committed to training students to get work experience and learning in the field of ocean environment. The bay takes in approximately 7 miles of shoreline from Black Point to Maunaloa Bay in Hawaii Kai. Next year there is a conference schedule that will bring approximately 10,000 people to Oahu.

The MAKAHA SONS are the featured entertainment, along with, of course, the opportunity to meet RI President Ravi Ravindran.

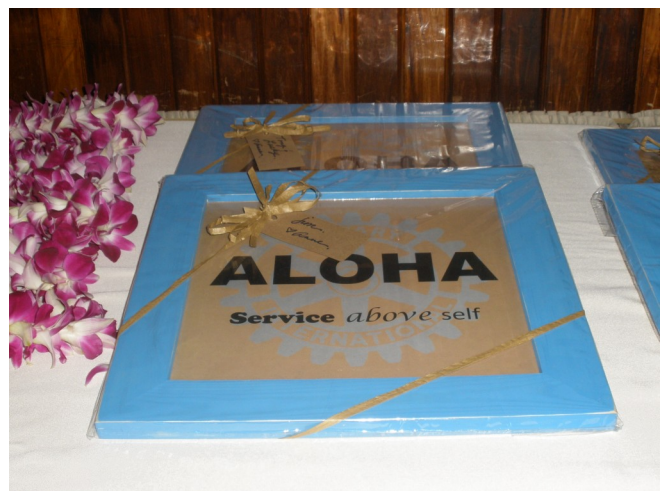
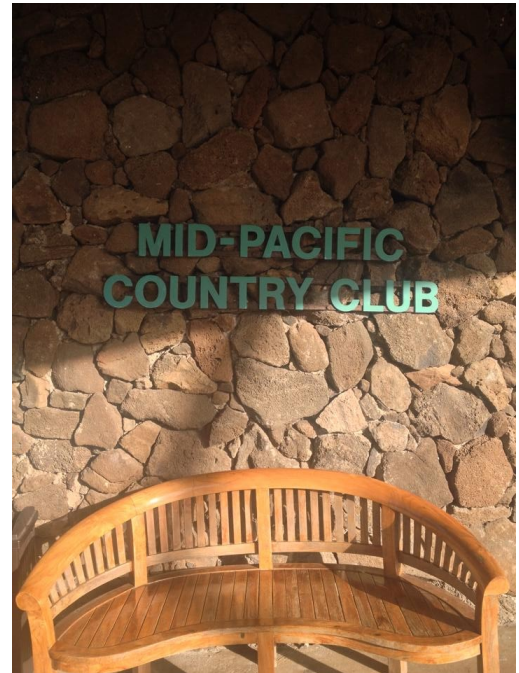

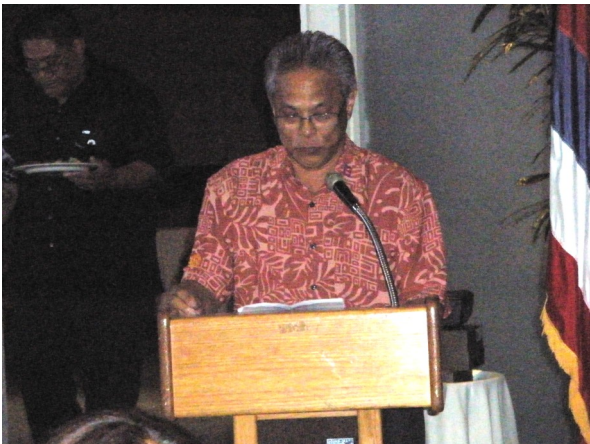
