Jane Muro was our speaker representing her own company "Ship to Hawaii" a for profit company. Her company consolidates shipments exclusively from IKEA on the mainland. IKEA is

a household retailer encompassing everything for the household including furniture, linens, dishes, appliances, etc. which can be very expensive to ship to Hawaii. IKEA will not ship merchandise thus the need for "Ship to Hawaii" as a consolidator of heavy merchandise. Jane is an ardent shopper at IKEA when she visits the mainland and was shocked at how difficult it was to have her purchases shipped home and felt there was a need to be of service to the people of Hawaii. Ship to Hawaii handles the shipping, packaging and Insurance for merchandise shipped for a fee of from 40 to 75% of the value of the shipment. They ship every 2 to 3 weeks and will deliver directly to your door for an additional fee. They have a small showroom in Kalihi for those not familiar with IKEA.

Other happenings at our meeting was recognition for Jack 's 6 anniversary with the RCEH and Jim Morris on his 11th year anniversary.

Lucky Cara gave us a report of the School Supply Drive for Palolo Elementary School at Kahala Mall last Saturday.
