

Online" 350k malware are released every day and antiviruses are only about 75% effective. For wireless networks you should look for WPA2 AES. There are different types of encryption for wireless. Make sure that Oceanic/Hawaiian Telcom set your wireless up on WPA2 AES. Bluetooth should be turned off on your phone when not needed. There is a recent vulnerability with Apple Airdrop. To surf the web anonymously use search engine called "tor". With this, the government cannot see where you're surfing. To search anonymously use the website DuckDuckGo. If your identity is compromised do a credit freeze through all three credit bureaus so no one can open an account in your name. Equifax, Experian and Transunion.


