Nick Abbott opened the meeting by announcing that due to work challenges, Liam Martin finds it necessary to resign from the club.

Judith Clark of Hawaii Youth Services was our speaker. Her

subject was teen pregnancies in Hawaii and the nation. She says that Hawaii has the 17 largest number of teen pregnancies and 2/3rds are in the 18 - 19 age group. Of these groups, Foster Care teens are the most likely to become pregnant.

80% of unwed mothers receive government assistance at the expense of the tax payer. Children born to unwed mothers have many challenges including health problems as well as a higher school dropout rate and a lower education. They are also three times likely to be incarcerated in later life.

Parents are normally not prepared to take care of a newborns as well as the young mother.

A survey found that 99% of parents felt sex education is important for their children however only 50% actually have spoken to their children about sex. 40% of teens have had sex prior to receiving sex information. Most teens are not aware that access to clinical services are available to them. In Hawaii sex education is funded at the lowest level in the country. 97% of parents agree that sex education be taught in schools as 19% of 8th graders have already had sex and 50% of high school seniors are sexually active.

## Now arrives a SECOND Duck Race. this one sponsored by the Hawaii Kai Rotary Club. (3/27/13)


