Advance directives come in two sections; what you would like to have planned and who will follow out those plans. An advance directive is a document that states your medical wishes for your final days. The question we need to ask ourselves

when preparing your advance directive is "how will it affect my quality of life?". If the decision works with your quality of life plan, then include it and have it discussed with family, friends and decision-makers to know and understand your final wish. It's critical that an individual plan and communicate their medical wishes with family and friends. Communication and planning are the key steps in a successful advance directive document. It is also important to have a copy of your advance directives on hand.

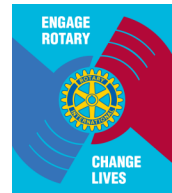
