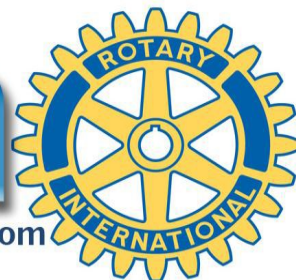

University of Hawai'i at Hilo Athletic Director Dexter Irvin today announced the selection of Central Washington University Associate Head Coach GE Coleman as the new Vulcan men's basketball coach. Coleman's official start date is July 1.

At Central Washington, Coleman ran one of the NCAA Division II's top offenses. In five of the past six seasons, the Wildcats were among the top 10 scoring teams and appeared in four straight Regionals (2008-11). The 2010-11 squad captured the Regions' top-ranking and finished fifth in the final NABC Ranking.

A 2005 graduate of CWU, Coleman's collegiate coaching career began as an assistant at NCAA Division I Eastern Washington University (2005-07). He helped develop six-year NBA veteran Rodney Stuckey of the Detroit Pistons, the 15th overall pick of the 2007 draft.

On the CWU staff since 2007, Coleman was the lead recruiter of 17 all-conference selections and three newcomers of the year as the Wildcats were 111-54 (.673) during that span. In the classroom, 10 players earned academic all-conference recognition. His responsibilities also included academic advising, student/player and alumni development, operations management and coordinating CWU's basketball camps.

Off the court, Coleman's teams were active in serving lunches in elementary schools and reading to students as well as CWU's Holiday Gift Project. He also helped the Kittitas School District Parent Group Bingo Night and the F.I.S.H. Food Bank.

Coleman's selection caps a two-month search following the resignation of former Coach Jeff Law, who took over as head basketball coach at Western New Mexico University.

The UH Hilo Men's Basketball team will be playing some of their games at the Afook-Chinen Hilo Civic Auditorium during the upcoming season.

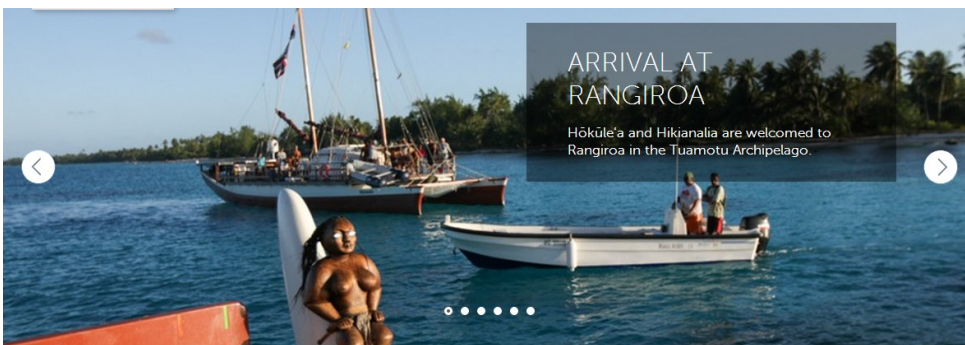

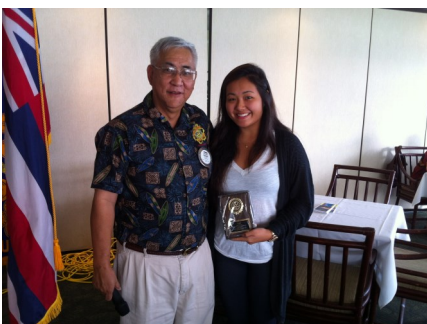

The EHHKK scholarship award was presented to Taniguchi on May 13 at the WHS Senior Awards Assembly by Past President Delbert Nishimoto.

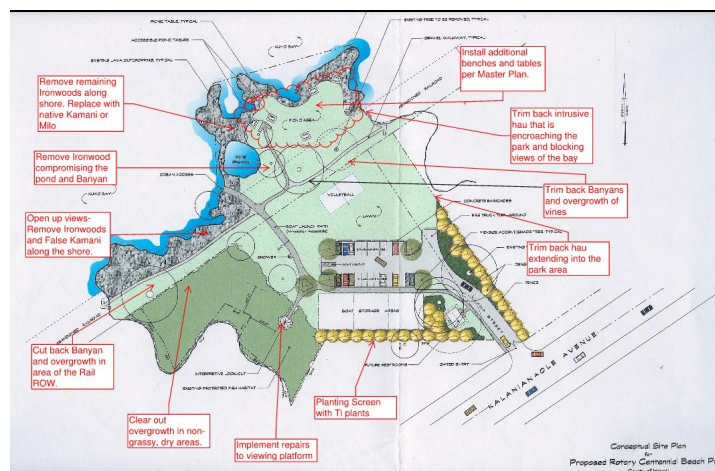

Board Meeting Minutes

Present: Cedric Mitsui, Barbara Hastings, Paula Uusitalo, Sandy Sakaguchi, Sandra Wagner-Wright, Sharon Scheele, Bettye Williams, Tomo Saito. Proxy votes assigned: Lorraine Davis (to Paula); Kris Speegle (to SandyS); Dale Tokuke (to Sharon); Rose Navalta (to SandraWW)

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Cedric at 7:00am at Coqui's Hideaway.

Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes: Minutes of the May 2014 board meeting were approved as circulated.
Motion by Sharon; Second by Sandra WW

Treasurer's Report: Copies of the May 2014 financial statements were distributed. Barbara moved to accept the May financial report; Second by Sandra WW. Motion was approved.

Service Directors:

1. Club Service. Barbara reported that 61 people have signed up to attend the Installation Dinner on June 25th.
2. Community Service. Cedric reported that the club will not be able to schedule the dictionary project at Waiakea Elem. this year. In the Fall the club will distribute to both 3rd and 4th graders there. It has been recommended that the club purchase 2 years of dictionaries so the school projects can be scheduled earlier in the school year, but the dictionaries are updated annually so this may not be a good option.
3. Vocational Service. No report
4. International Service. No report
5. Youth Service. Rotary Exchange Student Sol will be departing Hawaii on June 14, 2014, then will join other exchange students on a one-month tour of the US mainland.

Committee reports:

1. Administrative. The club awards assembly will be held on June 18th. Looking at options to expedite processing credit card payments at meetings. Barbara reported that the DG will be attending the club meeting on July 9th and has requested a meeting with the Board the evening of July 8th.
2. Membership. Emmeline dePillis has resigned. Two others may also be resigning. Marcia Sakai will transfer to the club on July 1st. Prospective member John Furstenwerth attended orientation on June 11th; his name is being circulated.

The abbreviated review process for transfer members and for former RCHB members who apply to return to active membership was published in the club newsletter for three weeks. Cedric reported that one member expressed concern about a shortened process for former RCHB members who apply to return. The member felt that the entire membership should have an opportunity to comment.

3. Fundraising. James has only 5 mugs left to sell. Barbara reported the club will not be ordering more.
4. Public Relations. Barbara discussed the website. Club Runner has great functionality, but is difficult to implement. Someone has been hired to assist (Funds are allocated in the budget). Also in the works is a separate website for Oktoberfest (but linked to RCHB) where people can buy tickets. The goal is to launch the website on July 15th. James Leonard is chairing Oktoberfest; Jaime is assisting.
5. Nominating Committee. Barbara is looking for a Sgt at Arms for next year. May look at having several people share the responsibility.

Unfinished Business:

1. Unpaid membership. One current member has not paid dues for the second half of the current year, and has not been attending meetings or activities. Invoices for the amount past due as well as the dues for the new year were emailed to the person in May. Sandy also talked to the member. Board consensus: if the member does not pay by June 30th, consistent with the Bylaws, the member will be terminated for non-payment of dues.

New Business:

1. Accounting. Paula recommended changing the club's accounting process to an accrual basis rather than the current cash basis, effective July 1, 2014. Under the cash basis, all money collected is posted as it comes in the door which means the 2014-2015 dues being collected now should be reflected in the current year, however the treasurer holds the checks until July 1, but credit card payments are reflected this year. Moving to the accrual basis would allow all dues payments to be reflected correctly in the 2014-2015 budget. As we move further into online payments, etc. it makes sense to move to accrual basis accounting. Motion by Sharon; Second by SandyS. Motion approved

Adjournment: The final board meeting of the 2013-2014 year adjourned at 8:10am.

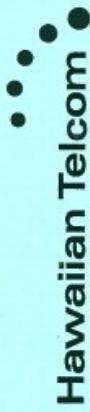

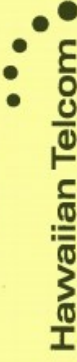

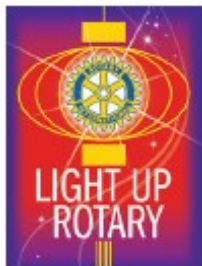
