The goal is to farm fish as sustainably as possible — namely, moving cages offshore to reduce many of the environmental impacts of aquaculture. The cost of anchoring cages in waters that are extremely deep, and the need to significantly scale the production of fish without impacting local water quality and seafloor biodiversity, make drifting cages offshore an attractive alternative to traditional near-shore cages.

Board Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Cedric at 7:00am at Coqui's Hideaway. Cedric expressed MAHALO to every Board Member and Committee Chair for their sacrifice this past year and leading the club to a successful year of Engaging Rotary, Changing Lives.

Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes: Minutes of the April 2014 board meeting were circulated via email. There was one correction: Under New Business, Item 4, Honorary Member discussion, Pete Muller's description should include "Charter President". Motion to approve the minutes as corrected by Sandra W; Second by Paula. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: Copies of the April 2014 financial statements were distributed to board members.

Sharon moved to accept the April financial report; Second by Sandra W. Motion was approved. Paula has requested waiver of fees and penalties from IRS. Suggestion that next year the club establish a Foundation.

Service Directors

1. Club Service. Reminder of the Installation dinner on Wednesday June 25th.
2. Community Service. The club won the first place award for Community Service for D5000-large clubs.
3. Vocational Service. The club won the first place award for Vocational Service for D5000-large clubs. Lorraine reported that the Rotarian-in-Spirit honor will be awarded in June.
4. International Service. No report
5. Youth Services. Kris reported that Kevin presented a plaque to outgoing President Micah at Rotaract's last meeting. The Interact club will be making a presentation to the Club at the May 14th meeting. Cedric reported that in October the District will be holding a regional Interact conference in Hilo. Cedric also reported that Rotaract may be asked to assist at the District 5000 conference to be held at the Hilton Waikoloa during Memorial Day weekend next year.

Committee reports:

1. Rotary Foundation. The club placed third in per capita giving in D5000-large clubs category. Cedric shared data from the District conference. Sandra W clarified that both donations to Polio Plus and general donations count toward Paul Harris Fellow designation. However, donations to Polio Plus do not count toward EREY –only donations designated as "shared"
2. HRYE. Richard reported \$4005 collected from 29 members. He has been meeting with other clubs in East Hawaii and has been successful in encouraging increased donations from those clubs.
3. Membership. The club had an 8% increase in membership. One new member will be inducted next week.
4. Newsletter. Will continue emailing to members for the remainder of the year. Need an editor for next year.
5. Fundraising. Selling the Polio Plus mugs was discussed. Price is \$20 with half going to Polio Plus and half to cover the costs. Club may consider using them as gifts to speakers.
6. Public Relations. Received 2nd place award for D5000-large clubs.
7. Rotary Centennial Park. James L. reported that the committee will be meeting today with the County Parks & Recreation people to identify what the County will be doing (have already started cleaning brush) and what Rotary will need to do.
8. Rotary Community Corps of Hilo Bay. Helped with Dictionary project and Rainbow Pride. Will be available to assist with Installation dinner.

New Business

1. Resignations. Three additional resignations have been received: Ken Goodenow (6/30/14); Ruth Kupcha (4/21/14), Jaime Ortiz (5/1/14).
2. Application/review process for transferring members and returning former members. The Board approved implementing an abbreviated process requiring only approval of the Board for active members in good standing from other Rotary clubs who want to transfer to RCHB, and for returning former members of our club. The requirements of attending 3 meetings, attending an orientation meeting, and circulating the name for 7 days to the general membership would be waived. Motion by Sharon; Second by James. Membership needs to be notified of this board action.


Other
