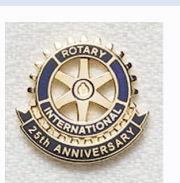

Getting To Know Tim Hansen

Tim is a farm boy originally from Minnesota. He is the second to the youngest of 9 siblings. Born and raised out in the country, he loves the smell of dirt and is thrilled with the miracle of plant growth. He now lives in Hilo with his partner of 17 years Kevin Reardon and their cat Jasmine. They are blessed to have a 1/2 acre lot filled with fruit trees and other growing things to eat, smell, and enjoy.

Tim is currently a Special Projects Coordinator with the Hawai'i County Office of the Prosecuting Attorney. In this position he does a wide variety of projects including

coordinating all volunteers and interns, seeking grant funds and is working to promote restorative justice and other evidence based practices in the criminal justice system on our island. Tim was previously the East Hawai'i Program Director of Coordinated Services for the Elderly for 5 years and was the Restorative Justice Planner for the Minnesota Department of Corrections for 8 years before moving to Hawai'i in 2008. He loves working with communities and systems professionals to explore and implement comprehensive response to crime, based on restorative justice principals. He has provided training for the National Institute of Corrections, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (Department of Justice), the Federal Balanced and Restorative Justice Project and has presented at numerous conferences across the country as well as in China.

He has worked with victims and offenders for over twenty five years. He has degrees in Psychology, Speech/Theatre Arts and Sociology from Winona State University in Minnesota and earned his Masters of Social Work degree in 2013 from the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. He is also a Wisconsin Licensed Social Worker and worked for several years with homeless families and children in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Tim is currently working toward his Clinical Social Work Licensure and was recently elected as the Big Island Representative to the Hawai'i Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.

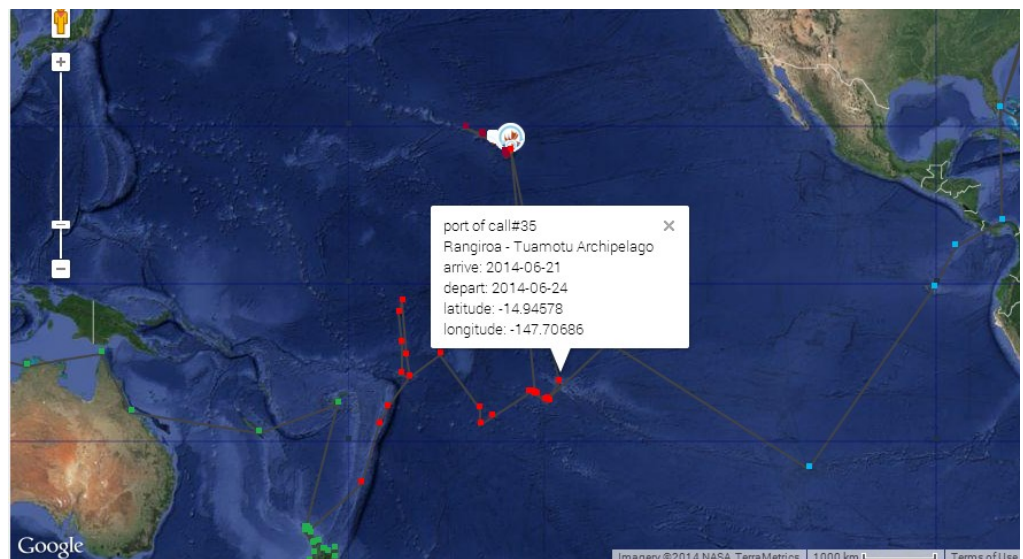

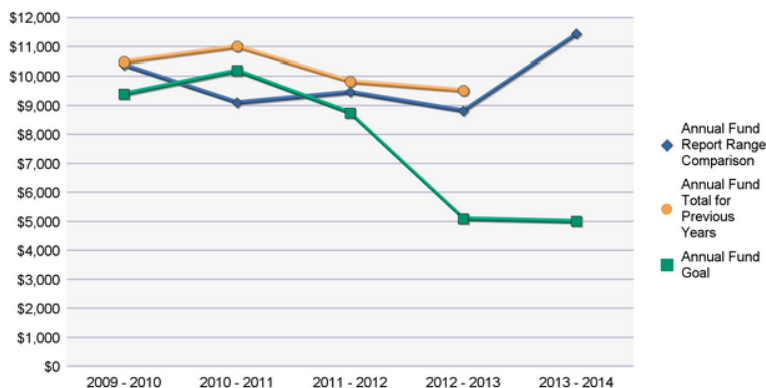
