

Aloha Fellow Rotarians and Friends,

November is Rotary's Foundation month. The mission of the Rotary Foundation (TRF) is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty. The Rotary Foundation (TRF) transforms your gifts into projects that change lives both in your local communities and around the world. Through our Foundation, we have the power to live the words of our Foundation's motto:

Doing Good in the World.

The Rotary Foundation helps fund our humanitarian activities, from local service projects to global initiatives. This year, our Club received a total District Designated Fund (DDF) of about \$19k, and the world fund will match another about \$8k towards our Global Grants. This year, we have 12 District Grants, and we are about to submit three new Global Grants, one in PNG, one in Nepal, and one in Palau. This is all thanks to your generous donations to our Foundation.

Your donation makes a difference to those who need our help the most through District Grants and service projects in our home and Global Grants all over the world in seven areas of focuses. The Foundation also leads the charge on worldwide Rotary campaigns such as eradicating Polio. We truly are so close to eradicating Polio; Rotary is at the forefront (cont on pg 6)



The Rotary Foundation is the economic engine for Rotary International. The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into service projects that change lives both close to home and around the world.

In 1917, Rotary International President Arch Klumph announced his idea for an endowment fund dedicated to "doing good in the world." With this short statement, Klumph inspired the establishment of The Rotary Foundation.

Today, The Rotary Foundation helps clubs and districts work together to perform meaningful, sustainable service. While Rotary International and Rotary Clubs are codified as a "social welfare" organization (501(c)4) and do not qualify for tax exempt status; The Rotary Foundation was established as the charitable arm of Rotary and IS a qualified 501(c)3 tax exempt entity. As a not-for-profit corporation, TRF is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotary members and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world. This support is essential to make possible projects, funded with Foundation grants, that bring sustainable improvement to communities in need. As one of the top rated foundations in the world, TRF has provided billions of \$\$\$ for life-changing, sustainable projects that help people in need around the world get clean water, medical care, literacy classes, disaster aid and other essentials.

Our mission

The Rotary Foundation helps Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty.

Every Rotarian, Every Year

Every minute of every day someone's life is being improved by our Rotary Foundation. Doctors in Romania are learning advanced skills that change the lives of the children they treat, Polio survivors are provided with wheel chairs so they do not have to crawl, poor women in India are given training and micro-loans to alleviate extreme poverty while water/sanitation and hygiene is being brought to remote areas of Nepal to reduce disease and improve health. In a world where the divide between the haves and have-nots is growing, we as Rotarians must do our part and "do good in the world."

District Grants

District Grants allow Rotary clubs to identify, plan, and fund worthy projects in their own communities or internationally. This year our District Grant is funding Women in Need, Pearl Haven gazebo project, Ala Wai Elementary School improvements, Lunalilo Elementary School improvements, Shopping with Hugs, US VETS transitional housing, Farrington High School JROTC, Jefferson Elementary School improvements and more... The majority of funding comes as a result of contributions to TRF Annual Fund; so, the more we give, the more opportunities and funding we will have for future projects.







Global Grants

Global Grants are funded by combining Club funds, District Designated Funds (DDF), The Rotary Foundation (TRF) World "Matching" Funds and in some cases, funds from Cooperating Organizations. Global Grants support large international activities with sustainable high-impact outcomes that have a long-term impact. The Rotary Club of Honolulu Sunset is a major district player when it comes to Global Grants with projects planned, in-progress or completed in Papua New Guinea, Nepal, Malawi, Romania, Kwa Zulu Natal, South Africa, Egypt. We truly have global reach and impact.

Our past generosity has made this meaningful work a reality... continued contributions to the Annual Fund and the Endowment Fund make the future possible.


