In a change from the usual agenda, Club members enjoyed hearing first from our Guest Speaker. **Kent Reinker** introduced Zak Noyle, who is one of the world's top surfing photographers. Zak's work has been featured on the Dutch National Geographic. He is the only photographer allowed to photograph the Eddie Aikau Surf Contest. Among other awards and honors, Zak was selected as one of the 25 most influential sports photographers in the world.

Zak shared many examples of his tremendous work. One of these was one of his most wellknown photographs, "The Wave of Change." The Wave of Change is a photograph taken in Indonesia of a surfer surfing a barrel wave with trash. Through the photo, Zak has among other things, increased awareness for cleaning up our waters. The photo was shown on the cover of Dutch National Geographic. Another of his most well-known photos which Zak shared included "The Perfect Day," which was shot in Tahiti. Zak shared numerous other examples of his work, which include not only surf photos but many other types of photos as well. These included photos of Olympic gold swimmer Michael Phelps, and various subjects in Cuba, which were taken with an iPhone for which Zak received a tweet from Apple CEO Tim Cook congratulating him on his great photos.

Zak's mission statement and vision are:

Mission: To form strong connections between his imagery and the people viewing them through creative, authentic, visual contact.

Vision: Personify and share the amazing natural beauty that our world has to offer.

In addition to his world famous photography, Zak has numerous philanthropic ventures. Every1nehawaii, a foundation began by Zak, brought in over 1,000,000 face masks into Hawaii when the COVID-19 pandemic started in 2020 and many people did not have access to masks. The platform is to energize youth and to encourage voting with an unbiased and nonparty approach. Zak is part of the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, which raises money for scholar athletes.
