President Paul announced Diana Sakurai's birthday and Ananda Ferreira's club anniversary. Announcements included **Rick Tabor** asking for volunteers to distribute gift bags at Mayor Wright Homes tomorrow, Lee LaBrash inviting more to volunteer for the Shriner's Hospital and Fernhurst caroling and Christmas craft event on December 19, and James Pierce who was thrilled with all of the toiletries already brought to distribute at the IHS dinner on December 26th. Toiletries may still be brought next week. Diana Sakarai announced story time with gingerbread cookies and wreaths at Mayor Wrights Homes and Kuhio Park Terrace, December 21. Volunteers are needed. And **Tom Coyne** asked for more volunteers for the Hawaii Beer Fest from 4 to 9 pm on Saturday, January 25 at the Hawaii Convention Center.

The program was a report on the RCOH Thailand service project (plus side trips to Laos and Vietnam) from October 26 through November 4 given by **PP Dave Shanahan**. **Dave** announced the project was planned by **Don Anderson** and turned over to him to run in Thailand. Via a power point presentation, **Dave** showed the location of this trip and prior RCOH service project trips in Southeast Asia. Using many interesting and lovely pictures, he described the activities and events of the trip. Prior to the work project, trippers took in the shops, cooking classes, an elephant preserve and city tours. At the Lamphun YMCA work project, they built, paneled and lacquered walls, moved chairs (multiple times), set in pavers, painted walls, extended an awning for shelter, and generally labored hard. They also brought some fun to the villagers including crafts, hula lessons, English lessons and just plain fun times. After the project's completion the group went to Hanoi where they stayed at the Metropole and visited the Hanoi Hilton.
