And then came the splendid program! **President Bub** continued his successful "talk story" format with our guest speaker, Evan Killips, Project Manager, City Mill. Evan is the 4th generation of the family that owns City Mill, and **Bub** is eager for us all to learn about family succession in their privately owned company.

City Mill was started 120 years ago to mill rice and unpack lumber by Evan's great-grandfather. Hanging in the original office was an old Chinese proverb: When you drink the water, remember the source. (**Bub** said that proverb was hanging in his great grandfather's office too!)

Evan said his parents never pressured him to go into the family business. He got a BA at Washington University in St. Louis, an MBA at USC, and became a successful financial portfolio manager, then a retail consultant and then a successful owner of an e-commerce business. He stressed that his parents never pressured him to go into the family business, but he felt that in the back of his mind he would always know that he would like to come back to Hawaii. He said the decision was made much easier by the fact that his wife is from Hawaii too.

Evan said one of his "Wo" friends asked him to help set up CSWo's on-line purchasing, and Evan's company had been doing exactly that. Evan did a great job in setting up City Mill's online purchasing as well, knowing that this Hawaii company was competing against Amazon, Blockbuster Video, Comp USA, etc., with their free shipping, free returns, etc. He feels that City Mill is still evolving as it works out the "Amazon Effect" on all businesses. He said "digital" has changed all customer expectations. City Mill has 30,000 items in its inventory (screws to lumber to furniture—sorry, **Bub**——to hardware to, well, you get the idea), and it is all online. Evan's focus has been the e-commerce aspect of the company.

When Evan and his wife decided to come back to Hawaii and that he would indeed be joining the family business, the family hired a family business consultant (Who knew there was such a thing?!) and went to family business meetings (Again, who knew there were such meetings??!) The family worked out a rotation for Evan so that he really did learn every aspect of other family businesses as well as their own family business. Right now Evan is project managing the email department, and he says his mom and uncle have been very supportive of him. Evan says down the road he'll probably want to progress faster than his uncle wants to, but that's to be expected.

Evan feels that the most crucial part of a successful business (family-owned or otherwise) is communication, and to communicate in a "non-disagreeable" manner.

Bub threw in a comment about his family's success in bringing in "the youngsters" was achieved when his father and uncle moved their offices to their factory, so the rest of the staff was not able to go to "the older folks" with their questions or comments.

Evan wants to continue City Mill's generosity in the community, and is doing so through the Gift Foundation. One of the Gift Foundation's recipients, Ho'ola Na Pua, is also a recipient of our club's time, talent and treasure as well. Evan intends to follow his passion of converging his interests with the home improvement capabilities of his family firm in such projects as Christmas in April.

With a stellar young man at its helm, City Mill is bound to continue to be a leading business in Hawaii.
