Member **Joanna Amberger** provided us with a great update to our Service Above Self Campaign. Joanna reported that we are 77% to our goal of \$100,000. Joanna complimented the success to date, and requested those who have not committed yet to give what you can.

Club Members then went into breakout rooms to discuss the topic, "What is your big plan for the next 12 months?"

**Past-President Rick Towill** then introduced our guest speaker, Hi'ilei Kawelo. Hi'ilei is the founder and Executive Director of Paepae o He'eia. Paepae o He'eia is a private non-profit organization dedicated to caring for He'eia Fishpond. He'eia Fishpond is the ancient Hawaiian fishpond located in He'eia, Ko'olaupoko, O'ahu.

Hi'ilei began by discussing the history of fishponds in Hawai'i and on O'ahu. The fishponds were created over 800 years ago as an efficient way to feed large amounts of people. At one

time there were 98 fishponds on O'ahu and 72 on Moloka'i, among others. Over time, the fishponds located in Kane'ohe in particular began to be filled in, as developers began developing and space was needed to put excavated material.

Paepae o He'eia was started in 2001. It is celebrating 20 years this years. Its goal is the restoration of the He'eia Fishpond. In 2015, it completed a major project when it repaired and closed a large hole in the wall of the Fishpond, which had occurred in 1965 as a result of a severe flood. The repair of the large hole meant that the Fishpond was now operational and that Paepae o He'eia could now turn its attention to starting fish production, which it has been doing. In addition to working on fish production, Paepae o He'eia, through its staff and volunteers, works continually to maintain and care for He'eia Fishpond. At the conclusion of Hi'ilei's talk, **President Rich** presented the book, "The Heart and the Bottle," to be signed by Hi'ilei and President Rich and donated to a local elementary school.
