Linda noted the value of building friendships in Rotary... that serving together, laughing together, making a difference at home and around the world together, is well worth bringing new members into our Honolulu Club `ohana. Friendships that will last forever.

PP **Gwen Yamamoto Lau** presented the 2022 Rotary International Citation, awarded to our club for helping Rotary to change lives of people all over the world, and signed by Past RI President Shekhar Mehta. In exchange for the citation, **President Lyla** gave **Gwen** her Past President pin. She then asked **Beth-Ann Kozlovich** to introduce our **Guest Speaker, Michelle Ka`uhane**, the Senior VP and Chief Impact Officer at the Hawaii Community Foundation, which has served all Hawaiian Islands for 107 years.
