<u>12:25 p.m. Guest Speaker.</u> Maja Grajski introduced the speaker for this week, Mahina Paishon-Duarte, who is the founder of Waiwai Collective. Mahina mentioned that she serves on several boards and commissions throughout the state and is active in social entrepreneurship. She talked about her leadership experiences including working as the head of a school, serving on the Hawaii Tourism Authority and the Trust for Public Land.

Mahina introduced "Aina Aloha Economic Futures," an initiative she started during the Covid pandemic with a group of 14 local leaders. The purpose of this initiative is to show businesses how for-profit entities can thrive by incorporating Hawaiian community driven values into their broader mission.

In response to a question, Mahina spoke passionately about the importance of supporting local fish ponds and the relationship between indigenous centered leadership and positive environmental outcomes.

Mahina's concluding message that "the solution is within 'us,' the people of Hawaii" reinforced the overarching concept of "huliau" --the stewarding of sacred spaces. She closed by stating that we need to recommit to doing things the way they have been traditionally done in Hawaii as this will lead to stronger economic communities throughout the state and internal transparency.
