


President's Message

By working together with open hearts and loads of enthusiasm we accomplished some wonderful things this year

- Donated \$1,000 to the Shelter Box Project to help provide shelter to those affected by the disastrous earthquake in Nepal
- Kona Mauka participated in a Global Grant supporting a water project in Kosovo.

- Sponsored students for the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) camp at Kilauea Military Camp
- Hosted a Family of Rotary Beach Day at Pu'uhonua O Honaunau

He is also Kumu Hula and cultural advisor to Halau Na Wai Ola in Sunnyvale, California.

Fellowship brings some important ideas to mind, including sharing, connection, and community. Rotary is an amalgam of individual communities — the club, the district, the region, and the world — each offering a different type of fellowship.

Rotary Fellowships, which are open to Rotarians and Rotarian spouses, help foster international understanding and can contribute significantly to individual communities. Because fellowships must have a member base from at least three countries, they are rooted in local environments, but at the same time link Rotarians with similar interests all over the world.

For example, members of the <u>International Fellowship of Rotarian Scuba Divers</u> participate in group dives once or twice a year at different spots around the globe. While they are in these exotic places, they contribute to a service project carried out by a local Rotary club. At the D5000 District Conference several Rotarians joined the Wine Appreciation Fellowship.

Each fellowship is officially recognized by the RI Board of Directors but operates independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, dues, requirements, and administrative structure.








Rotary International President's Message
