In other big news, April 2024 will be marked a historical occasion for Rotary District 5000.







3RD ANNUAL I LOVE BOOKS FAIR APRIL 6, 2023




President Kathy Lum welcomed the community to the 3rd Annual I LOVE BOOKS fair.
