TRF is recognized as one of the top foundations in the world because virtually all donations are used to benefit mankind through Rotary Club Service Projects.

It is only appropriate to mention that Rotary Foundation month was preceded by:

- Submitted GG2577119, Women-led Ghailaghari Eco-Village, Nepal. Our matching Grant totaled \$693.
- 2) World Polio Day, on Oct 24: fundraisers included Coins for Polio (\$40.50), and Da Color Purple (\$2,649 in total, \$650 in checks and \$1,999 Raise for Rotary). Thank you to our members, friends, and District leaders—DG Nancy Cabral (\$517.50), DGE Benson Medina (\$258.75), and DGN Richard Proctor (\$250)—for their exemplary support of a worthy cause. Rotary International will remove Raise for Rotary at month-end, for anyone who wants to support this great cause.
- A last-minute request was received to support the Nov 11, USA VETS celebration. Requested items were hygiene items and nonperishable food items. Kathy Lum, with her daughter Taylor, and member Hayden, purchased and bagged hygiene items. 10 bags of hygiene items were delivered to AG Tina Doty on Nov 10, who attended the event in Kapolei. Again, members donated \$200 to purchase hygiene items for our Veterans.


