October is Community & Economic Development month. Grant qualification workshop was held on Oct 11, requiring 2 members from each club to attend. June and Paul attended. The workshop was followed by Global Grant Project Fair, which included the 5 GG approved by RI:

- GG2577119: Women led Ghailaghari Eco-Village in Chitwan, Nepal. Need Assessment: This group of indigenous people economically struggling food sufficiency is less than 3 months a year.
- 2) GG2682638: Prevention/Control of NCDs through Community Outreach and Enhanced Medical Infrastructure. Need Assessment: There are young, disadvantaged people in Central Vietnam from orphanages and people with disabilities. Similarly, industries have a workforce shortage.
- GG2685623: Regional Outreach Opportunities in Training and Sustainability (ROOTS) for a Healthy Micronesia. Need Assessment: Health situation in Pohnpei is not good.
- GG2685991: Cocoon 2 Vietnam. Need Assessment: There are young, disadvantaged people in Central Vietnam from orphanages and people with disabilities. Similarly, industries have a workforce shortage
- GG2686088: Pediatric Congenital and Adult Oncology Reconstructions in Moldova. Need Assessment: In progress Application Status: In Press.

Please review the 5 GG approved by the District and RI. We need to select as soon as Nov 1.


