## 4. Discussion/ decision items

- Donations to March speakers: Muskego's Guatemala projects and Muskego Police Cadets.
   <u>Motion (Schenke, Delke)</u> to donate \$500 from the International fund to Mukwonago Rotary for the Guatemala projects. Following discussion, Schenke and Delke agreed to raise the amount to \$1000. Motion carried. Skip Muskego Police Cadets for now.
- Increasing the scholarship expenditures by \$9000 (two scholarships at \$3000 each and \$3000 for vocational/ technical scholarships) Received 18 applications from Whitnall students, 2 from Greendale students, 4 from Greenfield students, and 1 from a Martin Luther student.
   Applications were sent to the reviewers. The top three selected from Whitnall will receive scholarships, the top Greendale applicant and the top Greenfield applicant will receive scholarships. All remaining applications will be moved to round 2. There was only one application for the \$1000 trade/ technical/ vocational scholarship.

<u>Motion</u> (Schenke, Nocholas) to award the additional \$9000 as two \$3000 scholarships to round two winners, and \$1500 to the Muskego Police Cadets toward their national event. Motion carried.

- Club involvement in Muskego (history and future) Reviewed the December 22, 2021 minutes
  about this issue. Discuss and add additional memories. Reaffirm the previous decision to only
  be involved in Muskego for special occasions like Muskego Feeds and the Muskego Police
  Cadets; noting that activity should be a two-way street.
- 50<sup>th</sup> club anniversary: The prize will be a single \$50,000 award for a civic project. The money will come from the Scholarship Investment Fund. There will be a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner. Club will vote on the concept at the April 16<sup>th</sup> meeting.
