• **Speakers?**

- ⇒ Speaker chair: contact your speaker, get a commitment, confirm the commitment near the date, email Terri the speaker's name, topic and some information about the topic
- ⇒ Topics: RI asks we not select a political speaker, e.g. one who is running for election (incumbent or hopeful) or is campaigning on behalf of said person; nor one who is proselytizing. A history of religion or an objective comparison of religions is fine. Someone who is in elected office can be invited to talk about the office (at a non-election time), what's going on in that office, coming, etc. An example is the mayor's forum, County Executive talking about program changes, County Sheriff giving an update on the office.
- ⇒ People who have spoken to a Rotary club in the District

\$1 (each) for not wearing a Rotary pin; not checking your name off the sign in sheet; not signing in your guest or your speaker; not wearing your badge at the meeting; taking your badge home; "cussing" or insulting another Rotarian; your photo in the newspaper *and other fines the Sergeant at Arms levies*.

• **Happy Buck**

Opportunity to share good news, acknowledge someone's accomplishment, "brag"

• **Rotary pin**

Sergeant at Arms has additional pins for purchase. Suggested that you wear your pin at business and civic events, too.

• **Club shirt**

Each Rotarian is given the blue, golf style shirt to wear at club events, etc. You can purchase additional shirts from the Membership chairperson.

• **Rotarian at work shirt**

The bright yellow shirt is to be worn when performing road clean-up and other service projects

Membership types

Corporate/school/municipal: 1st person, the lead person, is a member of the club and of RI, has voting rights and can hold club/ district office. 2nd person (the alternate) is an adjunct member of the Club who has no voting rights and cannot hold club/ district office.

The corporate member pays 1 RI dues, 1 District dues, 1 Club dues and for 1 lunch. If both the member and the alternate/ adjunct member attend a meeting, they are billed for the second meal on the quarterly statement. If only one is present, there is no additional charge. If neither are present, there is no refund.

Family: Both are members of the club and of RI, both can vote and both can hold club/ district office. Both pay dues for RI, District and Club. They also pay for one lunch. If both attend a meeting, they are billed for the second meal on the quarterly statement. If only one is present, there is no additional charge. If neither are present, there is no refund. 2/21/2017
