Pathfinders was formed in 1970 as a shelter for runaway and homeless youth. It continued growing with the creation of Prevention Education (promoting healthy sexuality and sexual behavior) and Street Beat programs. Today, Street Beat continues to be the only youth-focused street outreach effort in Milwaukee.

After years of community planning and gathering youth input, Pathfinders expanded its services with the addition of two new programs. Q-BLOK is a supported housing program offering safe, stable housing and wraparound support for LGBTQ+ youth experiencing homelessness. The Drop-In Center provides a safe day shelter space, basic needs services and centralized case management.
