We believe older adults deserve to live a safe, financially comfortable, healthy life with assistance from community resources and social services if needed.

We envision a community where every older adult will be connected to the resources they need, and the opportunities that interest them, throughout the entire aging process.

The overall goal of SOA programming is to improve the health and well-being of older adults and to provide a means for community engagement and socialization to POISE\* them throughout the remainder of their lives. The five pillars are the cornerstone of our programming and each one touches on the health and wellness of the seniors, providing them with opportunities to learn new skills, socialize with their peers, live independently, and connect within their community.

\*Physical - exercise programs, nutritional training, fall prevention, strength training, including programs such as billiards, shuffleboard, tennis.

Occupational - crafts and hobbies such as ceramics, jewelry making, quilting, lapidary, woodworking, as well as music and dance.

Intellectual & Financial - technology instruction, tablet lending library, language instruction, Writers' Roundtable, and a variety of guest speakers are available for our participants. We have intergenerational programming to connect seniors with children in the community.

**S**ocial, Emotional & Spiritual - the ability to relate and connect with other people in the world, the ability to cope with life's challenges, and the ability to establish peace and harmony in one's life while defining purpose are all important to help seniors as they age. We offer focus groups as well events and social groups to provide interaction with others. **E**nvironmental - occupying pleasant, stimulating environments that support well-being is important at any age. Gardening, bird watching, and nature walks are a few of the activities that our participants have access to that help them stay in touch with nature.
