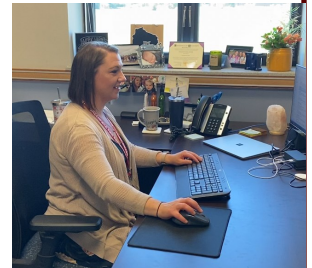

Maggie Sutton works alongside the fire department, police department, and the health department. "Ultimately, I am the bridge between the first responders and our residents and their needs." "I was blown away that there was such a disconnect between first responders and follow up care," Sutton said. Maggie Sutton is the first of a kind across the entire state



The job was built from the ground up. Workers found a need and a disconnect from when a first responder goes out on a call for something like homelessness, substance abuse, repeat 911 calls, and much more.

Within 24 to 48 hours of the patients' call to 911, Sutton will make a face to face visit.

"Maggie is able to come in and follow up and continue to make sure this patient or resident gets the proper help that they need. I guess it's just that follow up as paramedics we are just focused on what is the immediate issue," Greenfield Fire Department, Battalion Chief Dan Weber said.

This position will now allow her to dig deeper and provide programs and other forms of help to those in need. In fact, she works with them for up to three months to ensure they are taken care of.

The job description summarizes the position as: Perform Social Work and Crisis Mental Health services as a member of a mobile, community-based crisis intervention team providing varied services, outreach and guidance. Settings include homes, apartment complexes, CBRF's, schools, businesses, shelter care, group homes and other settings.
