The Rotary Rose Sale is more than just a fundraiser—it's an opportunity for your club to connect with the community in a meaningful way. And with the added twist of Deer Season, it's a fun and timely way to offer something special to your neighbors.

Here's the beauty of the Rotary Rose Sale: it's straightforward and community-focused. Each fall, the Hayward Area Rotary Club partners with a local florist to order dozens of fresh roses. Club members pre-sell the roses within the community, ensuring they know exactly how many to order. The roses are then picked up and distributed at the florist's shop, with club members assisting customers.

Aside from the obvious benefit of raising funds for your club's charitable efforts, the Rotary Rose Sale offers a great opportunity to engage with your community. It's a chance for your club members to get involved in a hands-on, rewarding activity.

The Hayward Area Rotary Club has found this fundraiser to be relatively low-cost, with most expenses covered by the modest \$20 per dozen roses. The profits, which often reach around \$5,000, go directly into funding scholarships and other community initiatives. Plus, with the added humor and appeal of being tied to Deer Season, it's a fundraiser that resonates with both Roses— a preemptive gift for the spouse just before hunting season.
