Mushrooms supplement income

“I’m growing oyster and paddy straw mushrooms. I sell them at a nearby market. I make ₹3,000 to ₹4,000 [US\$35-\$47] a month,” Munda says through an interpreter. “Now I can provide better food for my son.”

“It’s a very good, very profitable business which doesn’t require a lot of time and doesn’t require a lot of effort,” says Smita Sinha, the club’s executive secretary/director. “And at the same time, they can do their usual job, if they have one.”

Mitra adds that mushroom production is one of the few businesses that doesn’t require much money to start, nor even a plot of land.
