Carter's vision for peace

"We feel that there's a human right of people to live in peace," Jimmy Carter told The Rotarian. "We feel it's a human right to have a modicum of health care, to have a decent place in which to live, to have a chance to have an education, to have freedom of speech and freedom of religion and the right to elect your own leaders."

The Carter Center has observed 105 elections, including recent contests in Liberia, Kenya, the Philippines, Zambia, and Guyana, and it has worked with the United Nations and other groups to develop standards for democratic elections. When democratic avenues fail, the center mediates armed conflicts. It is currently involved in efforts to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, as well as conflicts in Sudan and South Sudan, Syria, and Liberia; it's also working to combat the rise in violent religious extremism and Islamophobia in Europe, the Middle East, and the United States.
