When Patrick Moore set out to raise money for **early childhood education** in his small Louisiana community, he faced one big problem: exhaustion. Potential donors were weary of being asked to give every day, twice a day, to different causes. After a while, people are just tired."

Children's brains form more than a million new neural connections every second from birth through age five.

Since businesses wanted good workers "I put together a kind of investment plan. By paying for early childhood education, we're basically planting seeds. This money will help our community have a stronger workforce in the future." "One person, when I told them that, said, 'Wait a minute, this is like a recruitment and retention program,'" Moore says. "I said, 'Bingo, baby! You've got it.'"

Rotary members raised close to \$500,000 by the deadline. The foundation matched that sum, and then the state government matched the total. Ultimately, the \$500,000 that Moore's club helped raise became \$2 million for early childhood education scholarships.
