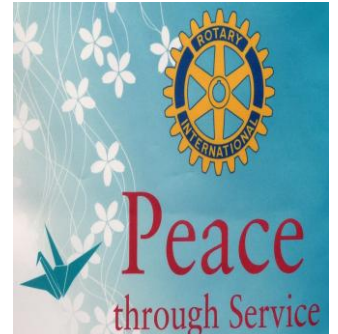

VISITING CHINESE MEDICAL STUDENTS; EDUCATING FUTURE DOCTORS



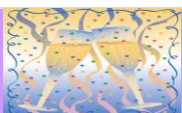
