**Major General (Retr), Barry Nunn, AO** gave a very well organised and delivered presentation on The Australian honours system and the four levels of the Order of Australia. Companion of the Order (AC), Officer of the Order (AO), Member of the Order (AM) and Medal of the Order.(OAM). The WA Branch of the Order of Australia Association is encouraging people to nominate more WA candidates for

one of these awards. Compared to other States WA lags behind in the numbers of people who have been recognised. Barry Nunn suggested we should consider nominating people from the community who have gone over and beyond the normal commitment expected of their role. Nomination forms were distributed and a brochure on how to go about the nominating process. Barry Nunn handed his AO medal (awarded in 1989) around (see photo) and was gratified to see that the storage box and medal were returned at the end of the meeting. All this was not new to President Glenys who was awarded the AO for her work in researching and persistence in helping to locate HMAS Sydney. There are undoubtedly several people in our community who would be worthy nominees for one of these awards. So now you know how the system works consider nominating someone.
