John Gray- Children's Fair Coordinator. John wants a full commitment from members, wives, and partners, please, to man up this major Club project which will be run on **Sunday, February 20th**. This will be the first year (the 22nd year) since it began when the founder PP Mal Robertson will not be with us but his good work lives on in the faces of the children who enjoy the day so much.

John is on the lookout for help in the following areas:

Children's Face Painting – Glenys McDonald will be the organiser this year. Anne-Marie Gray will run an evening workshop prior to the fair and we are seeking volunteers from partners and family members to participate in this very popular stall. **Please register your interest with Glenys and the**

arrangements for the work shop will be provided at a later date.

- **Help** – **Clancy the Clown** is looking for a body to fill his suit! **Any volunteers?** It can be shared if a couple of members want to act the clown publicly for a change!!!
- **Plant, Cake and Book Stall** – Looking for contributions from members for plants, books, cakes, produce, jams, pickles again this year. A very popular stall that is a handy and profitable contributor to the day. **No magazines this year thank you. The stall may be raided.**
- **We are looking for members to support our feature page in the Bunbury Mail the week prior to the fair.** Members prepared to assist should contact John Gray and he will pass their names on to Ray Philp who is in charge of publicity. The Bunbury Mail will then contact members who will be participating.
- On Monday Jan 17th at 4.30 p.m. we need members at Forrest Park to erect the advertising banner. It is a simple job and takes around 20 minutes. Needed are 3 men, a ladder and two shovels. Poles and banner to be picked up from the Club's container. A ute or light truck to carry the poles is required as they are 4 metres long. Ray Philp has arranged for the Bunbury Mail to attend for a photo shoot and a supporting article
- If any member knows of availability of sponsorship money we may be able to have the "**Suitcase Circus**". This is a 3 hour show broken up into 2 x 1 ½ hours and is a mixture of science, tricks, musical entertainment with audience participation. It holds children spell bound and they become enthusiastically involved. Give it some thought and let John Gray know of any avenues to pursue to secure funding.

- Finally this year funds raised will be distributed to the following assuming that a profit is made, \$2,000.00 to Foundation earmarked for Polio Plus and \$3,000.00 towards the Children's Playground to be purchased by the Club and installed at the Bunbury Regional Hospital. The Kokoda Trek boys have "pledged" \$6,000.00 towards this project and with the Children's Fair funds the goal of \$12,000.00 is getting closer.

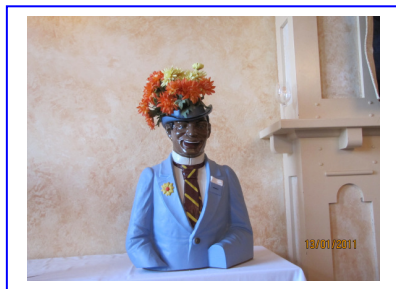

A little while later Murray managed to draw the winning Ticket in the jackpot which was worth a similar amount. Pres Neil thought this

was the hand of God at work, some said karma, others said good luck but congratulations Murray.



Guest Speaker: Morris Johnston stepped in at short notice to talk on his passion, the collecting of items of heritage interest that capture and preserve the past for future generations. The photo of the "Carnival Maker" opposite was an item that Morris saw in a second hand shop and felt he must buy. Currently it serves as a flower display but would have appeared at early Agricultural shows in the early 1900's as something you slipped a coin into to hear a recorded message. Morris showed us a

photo of an enormous sized roof ventilator he rescued from an asylum in Perth and is now installed in his roof where it releases all the hot air that builds up in the roof cavity of his home in Picton Crescent. Also mentioned was the cottage in Bunbury built in 1878 which Morris bought and fully restored some years ago and now rents out to tourists. Morris has three criteria he uses to help decide if an object is worth procuring and restoring to its former glory. 1. Is it working or can it be easily restored to a working condition? 2. Will it last for years? 3. Is it pleasing to the eye? Well done Morris for a very entertaining and informative presentation.

Last week at KBSC all the salads members provided were first class. (How's that for diplomacy) . One had a very special flavour and a mini competition was held to guess the ingredients. We asked the salad maker to come forward and hopefully give us the recipe. Sue Cornwell was the salad maker and thanks Sue for sharing your recipe with us.

Lentil Salad with Baby Beets and Feta.

- 1 cup French style lentils,
- 3 cups water,
- 1 bay leaf,
- 1 tin whole baby beets (I used real ones)
- ½ finely sliced red onion,
- ½ cup chopped Italian parsley,
- ½ cup chopped coriander leaves,
- 1 minced garlic clove,
- Salt and pepper,
- 3 tbs olive oil,
- 1 tbs seeded mustard,
- 2 tbs lemon juice,
- ½ cup crumbled feta cheese, (I forgot to put that in!!)

Directions:- in medium saucepan bring the lentils, water and bay leaf to boil over med-high heat. Reduce the heat and simmer until tender, about 25 mins. Drain off any excess water and remove bay leaf.

Combine olive oil, lemon juice, mustard, garlic and s&p. pour over warm lentils and lightly toss.

In serving bowl lightly toss the dressed lentils together with the red onion, baby beets, parsley and coriander. Top with crumbled feta. Serve warm with crusty bread!
