

The centre caters for children from the southwest region with quite severe intellectual disabilities. One project involves early intervention with some main streaming/ inclusivity prior to year 1 which has been successful in socialising students ready for formal education. For some of the older students technology such as iPad/ smart board have meant students can now communicate what they know and request their needs using the touch pad technology. This has increased engagement and motivation, because it is interactive.

Other life skills projects include, sail into life, riding for disabled, cooking, shopping, and learning to swim.

PP Glenys presented a cheque for \$2000 to Janet. 'Bruce thanked Janet and Naomi for their passion and dedication to the centre. Naomi has been a voluntary advocate but was recently admitted to chair of school council SBSEC.
