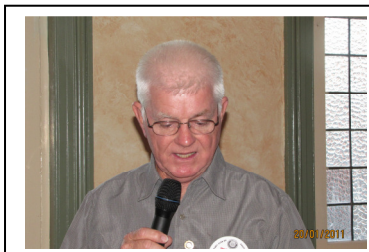

Guest Speaker: Lewis Winter from BY City Council gave a thought provoking talk that challenged all of us to think of how well prepared we all are to manage should a calamity such as a major fire, cyclone, earthquake etc arrive and upset our daily lives. Some points he made were:

- Only one day's petrol supply held in fuel station tanks in Bunbury.
- Supermarket shelves can be emptied in hours.
- You can exist on 1 litre of water per day at a pinch
- Need for everyone to be self reliant for at least 3 days before most essential services are usually connected again.
- A backpack kit containing essential survival items should be kept in every household including things like torch, pocket radio, spare batteries, first aid kit, food (lifeboat biscuits,. I bet these would help members lose weight after 3 days.)
- Lewis is hoping the City of Bunbury can purchase standard kits in bulk to reduce costs and make these available for people to purchase.
- A role for Rotary in promoting the idea of self reliance for several days following a catastrophe which seem to be happening a bit more frequently these days
